


25. Peter's Boast

However, Jesus knew the truth about what was about to happen. It would be terrible. He had to pray to God, his Father, for help. So he took some of the disciples to the Mount of Olives to pray. He knew that God's plan was that he would be put to death. Jesus knew that he would be punished by God for the sins of others. This is what we call boasting. It's when we talk about ourselves and how great we are. It's being proud with our words. Peter was boasting that he was better than all the other disciples.

But Jesus knew what Peter was really like. God knows what is inside our hearts. There is nothing that is hidden from him. He knows the past and the future. Jesus told Peter that

26. Story Wheel


You will need:

Two A4 sheets of thick card
or two paper plates.

Colouring pencils.


Scissors or a craft knife


A split pin fastener



1. Cut two circles of card 20 cm in diameter or get two paper plates of that size.
2. Photocopy the story circle on the next page and colour the pictures. Stick it onto the centre of one circle or plate.
3. Copy or trace the circle on the following page and carefully cut out the window shape.
4. Push a split pin fastener through the centre of both circles or plates.
5. Spin the top circle to view the pictures and tell the story.

You could use this as a pattern to draw your own story wheel.
