



Saviour

(Matthew 1:21, Romans 5:6)

Do you know what your name means? The name Jesus means 'God is the Saviour'. Before Jesus was born an angel told Joseph to give that name to the baby.

Jesus would save his people from their sins when he died for them on the cross.

Sin deserves punishment from a just and holy God. Jesus took that punishment for those who repent and trust in him. Instead of punishment they receive forgiveness and eternal life.

Redeemer

(John 8:36)

If a person was kept as prisoner, it could be possible to set them free with a payment of money. This is called 'redeeming'. The person who paid the price is a redeemer.



Jesus is called the Redeemer. He paid the price for sin. This delivers his people from slavery to sin. The price he paid was not money, but his death on the cross. This great price bought our freedom.

Have you ever saved your money for something special? Jesus paid a great price to save his people from sin. It wasn't money - what was it?



Prophet

(Hebrews 1:1-2, John 16:13)

In the Bible there are many books written by prophets – Isaiah, Jeremiah, Hosea, Joel and others. These men were instructed by God to tell people what his will was for the present and the future.

Jesus is the great Prophet. Through his Word and Spirit, we are taught about God, about our sin and about God's great plan of salvation.

In the past God spoke through his prophets. Now he speaks through his Son, the Lord Jesus. We must listen to his Word and be guided by his Spirit.
