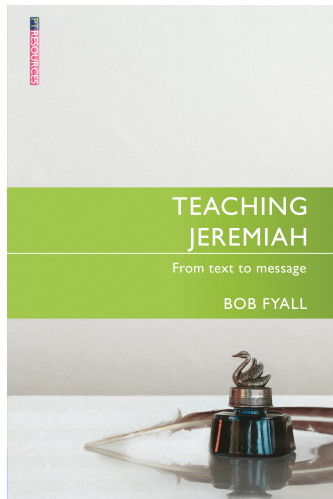


Teaching Jeremiah

DESCRIPTION

Jeremiah was called to warn Israel that their rebellious hearts and rejection of God and his ways would lead to judgement. His prophecies of Babylonian exile and the destruction of the temple come to pass, but in among the bad news, he also brings the promise of hope – that the people will return to the land, that God will send his Messiah, and that all nations will one day acknowledge Israel's God. 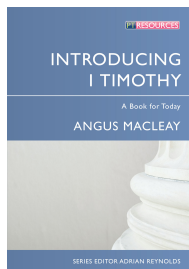
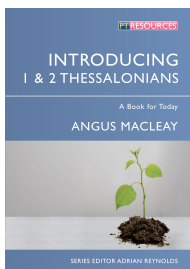
