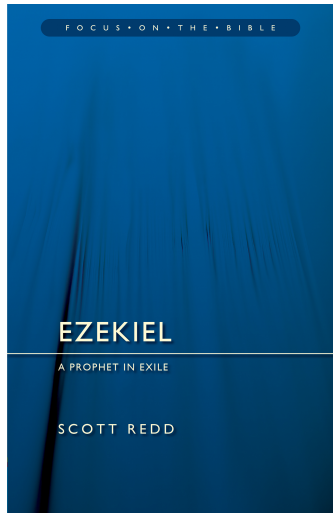

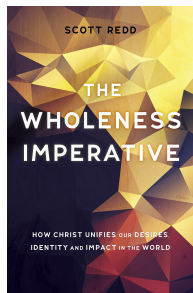

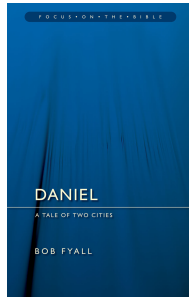

DESCRIPTION
