


He Gave Us a Valley

After twelve years of missionary work in the Belgian Congo, building up a simple medical service, Helen Roseveare found herself in the midst of a civil war. She was brutally beaten and raped and left with no choice but to return to Britain. She returned to the Congo in 1966 to assist in the rebuilding of the nation.
